Information Packet and Clinic Registration Form

Thank you for your interest in registering in The Nokota Horse Conservancy's® summer clinic with Justin Dunn.

This packet contains information to register for the clinic including hotel information. This packet along with total amount due is required to be registered for the clinic. We look forward to having you at the clinic and are committed to making it a memorable learning experience. Please call us if you have any questions – 701-254-4205.

Details:

- Clinic runs from approximately 9:00 to 5:00 each day;
 - Breakfast will be served each clinic morning from 7:00 – 8:30 a.m.
 - Lunch break taken each day for 1 hour or a bit longer. Lunch is provided for clinic participants and auditors.
 - Dinner will be served shortly after the clinic ends each day – roughly 5:30 p.m.
- If arriving before the first day of the clinic, please inform The Nokota Horse Conservancy® office of your estimated arrival time/date so that we may have someone available to welcome you.

What to Bring to Clinic (Participants and Auditors):

- Rain Gear
- Sun protection
- Lip protection
- A warm coat, hat, gloves (while the weather is generally nice in June, it can be very hot or pretty cold)

What participants should bring:

- Horse safe footwear for all weather conditions
- Rope halter (such as the Weaver silvertip)
- 12 foot yacht rope (preferably with no hardware)

Other optional equipment (may or may not get used, depending on where the horses/handlers are at):

- 22 foot yacht rope with circle attachment
- Stiff training stick with string (carrot stick)
- Bareback pad
- Saddle pad
- Saddle
- Cinches 32 inches or less

Dogs: As much as we love dogs, we ask that your dogs remain at home

Cancellation Policy: Clinic will be held rain or shine. In the event you need to cancel, a refund will not be given.

Directions: Directions to Nokota® Colt-Starting Clinic at the Paul Silbernagel Ranch: (June 10-14, 2018)

Take Highway 13 east from Linton one mile to the first RIGHT past the Seaman Park turn (look for the sign at the hwy entrance and the **red gates**). Turn right into ranch entrance through the double red gate. Follow the road approximately 1 mile to the corrals.

I understand the potential dangers that I could incur in mounting, riding, walking, boarding, and feeding of horses, including but not limited to, any interactions with other horses not owned by myself. Understanding those risks I hereby release., The Nokota Horse Conservancy® and Justin Dunn Horsemanship, trainers, instructors, clinic assistants, the clinic sponsors, farm owners, managers, employees and auditors, from all claims, demands, action or cause of action of any kind or nature whatsoever, whether now known or ascertained, or which may hereafter develop or accrue me in favor of myself, representatives or dependents, on account of or by reason of any injury (even death), loss, or damage, which may be suffered by me or them, or to any property animate or inanimate, belonging to me or used by me, because of any matter, thing or condition, negligence or default whatsoever and I hereby assume and accept full risk of danger or any hurt, injury or damage which may occur through or by any reason or any matter, thing, or condition, by any person whatsoever. 3).
